

## **Cumberland Family Medical Center, Inc.**

### **An Historical Timeline of the Organization**



- 2006** \*Application was made for a New Access Point with a 10-county service area in south-central Kentucky  
\*A grant award from the Foundation for a Healthy KY to assist with application process
- 2007** \*A New Access Point (NAP) awarded for establishment of Cumberland Family Medical Center, Inc.  
\*Dr. Eric Loy was appointed by the Board of Directors as CEO and Chief Medical Officer
- 2008** \*New services are added: school-based preventive oral health care & the 340B Pharmacy Program  
\*Rural Quality Grant was received along with a Phase II award from the Foundation for a Healthy KY
- 2009** \*Clinton Family Medical Center, Russell Family Medical Center, and McCreary Family Medical Centers are opened
- 2010** \*Grants awarded: Phase III and KY Healthy Future Initiative YR1 grants from the Foundation for a Healthy KY
- 2011** \*School-based Health Center (SBHC) Capital grant awarded for purchase of “Wellness on Wheels” - our 40 ft mobile medical unit.  
\*Nine (9) new services added  
\*CFMC received designation as “Patient Centered Medical Home”  
\*Grants awarded: Increase Demand for Services Grant (IDS) and KY Healthy Futures Initiative YR2
- 2012** \*Jamestown Family Medical Center and Monroe Family Medical Center new sites are added  
\*New grant awards: Rural Network Planning; Capital Development Building Capacity; Immediate Facilities Improvement; Patient Centered Medical Home; and a New Access Point (for Hart and Green Counties)
- 2013** \*New sites added: Family Care of the Bluegrass/Women’s Care of the Bluegrass (four locations); Glasgow Pediatric Health Care; Greensburg Healthcare  
\*Our service area is expanded to include Franklin, Green, Owen, Anderson, and Barren Counties  
\*New grant awards include: Outreach and Enrollment Supplemental Grant; New Access Point (for Casey and Lincoln Counties); and Outreach and Enrollment Assistance Grant.
- 2014** \*Casey Family Medical Center and Gamaliel Family Medical Center are added along with five Healthy Kids Clinics in Russell County (our first SBHC sites)  
\*New grant awards: Expanded Services, Facility Improvement, Behavioral Health Expansion, and New Access Point (for McCreary and Wayne Counties)  
\*New service: Substance Abuse Counseling  
\*CFMC receives the 2014 National Quality Leader Award.
- 2015** \*Healthy Kids Clinics open 21 new sites in Adair, Casey, Clinton, Cumberland, and Wayne Counties  
\* Whitley Family Medical Center, our New Access Point, opens  
\*New administrative office and new Russell Family Medical Center construction projects open  
\* CFMC receives the Clinical Quality Improver/Access Enhancer Award
- 2016** \*Women’s Care of the Bluegrass opens and adds Boyle County to service area

*\* Women's Care of Lake Cumberland adds four locations and adds Pulaski to our service area*  
*\*Six additional Healthy Kids Clinics are added in Anderson County*  
*\* New grants awarded: Substance Abuse Service Expansion; Health Improvement Investment Project; Oral Health Service Expansion Grant; Quality Improvement Grant; New Access Point (for LaRue County) and the Delivery System Health Information Investment Grant*

**2017** *\*LaRue Family Medical Center and four Healthy Kids Clinics open and add LaRue County to service area*  
*\*Ten Healthy Kids Clinics open in Lincoln County*  
*\*Albany Family Medical Center opens to add a second location in Clinton County*

**2018** *\*First Choice Immediate Care opens in Adair County*  
*\*Infertility Services are added*  
*\*Healthy Kids Clinic - Glasgow Pediatric Health Care, a second pediatric site in Barren County, opens offering extended hours and obesity prevention/treatment services*  
*\*Greensburg Family Medical Center opens for second location in Green County*  
*\*Four Healthy Kids Clinics open in Green County; ten in Nelson County; five in Bardstown Independent Schools - adding another county to our scope*  
*\*Grants awarded: Quality Improvement Award and Substance Use Disorder and Mental Health Services Expansion Grant Award*  
*\*CFMC is recognized as a National Quality Leader*

**2019** *\*Twenty-three Healthy Kids Clinics open in Hardin County, adding another county to our service area*  
*\*Russell Admin Annex opens in February*  
*\*MyLyfe, added two new workplace clinics, MyLyfe-Dunnville and MyLyfe-Union College*  
*\*Opened new Women's Care of the Bluegrass Lawrenceburg site with US Representative Andy Barr in attendance*  
*\*Somerset Pediatric & Adolescent Associates opened in Pulaski County in May*  
*\*Promise Community Health Center, our first SUD-MAT specific site, opened in September*  
*\*Grants awarded: New Access Point grant for Marion County; School-based Capital Grant; Oral Health Infrastructure Grant; Integrated Behavioral Health Services Grant; and Quality Improvement Award.*

*\*Added four new counties to our service area: Hardin, Marion, Knox, and Shelby*  
*\*Made 12 adjustments to our scope of services*  
*\*Received a clean Operational Site Visit report*  
*\*Expanded our dental outreach team*  
*\*Hired 700<sup>th</sup> Employee*

**2020** *\*Added ten Healthy Kids Clinics in Barron County and four in Washington County*  
*\*Added Family Dental of Somerset in January*  
*\*Added Danville Internal Medicine and First Choice Danville in February*  
*\*Grants awarded: Coronavirus Supplemental Funding, CARE Act Funding, ECT Funding, Integrating Behavioral Health Services, Quality Assurance, and CADRE for new construction in McCreary*

**2021** *\*Added Frankfort Pediatrics and moved Family Care of the Bluegrass to a new location in March*

*\*Opened six Healthy Kids Clinics in Elizabethtown Independent School System and two in Frankfort Independent*

Over the past 16 years, CFMC has grown from a service area of 10 to 32 counties, from two to 213 sites by 2023 (167 of which are school-based health centers), a total of over 1020 employees, 246 clinical providers, and span five of Kentucky’s six U.S. Congressional Districts. Both US Senators Rand Paul and Mitch McConnell, along with US Congressmen Ed Whitfield, James Comer, Hal Rogers, Andy Barr, and Brett Guthrie have repeatedly visited our sites.
